"We wanted a clean, transitional space that allowed for a variety of materials and pieces to be added that would complement each other," says Jeff Lindgren, designer at Streeter & Associates.

As a result, Streeter & Associates developed a "command central" concept that allows the homeowner the best of both worlds — monitoring the kitchen's atmosphere of cooking and kids, along with incorporating the beautiful views of the pond, tennis court and golf course.

"We decided to take the remodel to a different category by blending the new and the old, the traditional and the contempo-

rary by developing our own definition of transitional," Lindgren says.

The kitchen features enameled linen white windows complemented by walls with hand-made glazed brick tiles. The Euro-style cherry cabinets are offset by contemporary French Gray concrete countertops. Above the large island, a radius monorail lighting system boasts unique conversation-piece light fixtures. And a charming traditional linen white hutch with crown molding and glass panels melds with the state-of-the-art appliances.

"The homeowner really wanted the space to serve many different occasions while maintaining a comprehensive flow of traffic," Lindgren says. "We were shooting for calm, relaxing spaces that flowed from one to the other and would allow for multiple groups to sit back and enjoy the amazing features the space has to offer." LD

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
